Misreading the Scriptures and Missing Our Future

We've just been to 'Shaker Village', a heritage site a few miles from Asbury Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky. Built in 1805, this 3000 acre property was once home to a community of a few hundred Christians. Today Shaker Village, with over 30 restored historic buildings, is only of interest to tourists and historians. The 'Shakers', or more accurately The United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Coming, no longer exist. In fact, it is estimated that in 2019 only three elderly Shakers were to be found in all of

America!

The Shakers, were an offshoot of the Quakers in England, and had moved to America in the late 18th century. They were led by Ann Lee, who in 1770 had claimed to have received 'a special manifestation of Divine light'. Like the Essenes within ancient Judaism they isolated themselves from the 'sinful' outside world of people.

However, there was a deep flaw in their theological foundations. They believed (on the basis of Genesis 1:27) that God was both male and female, leading them to surmise that Jesus was only the male manifestation of Christ. Ann Lee, their leader, was the female manifestation of Christ and the 'bride prepared' for the Second Coming of Jesus! Although they showed many commendable traits like pacifism, simplicity, and moral sensibility, their lifestyle was shaped by a misreading and misapplication of the Scriptures. They were big on prophecy and ecstatic spiritual experiences and one of their deepest convictions was that Jesus's Second Coming (to unite with Ann Lee!) would definitely happen within their lifetime. (They also held that the original sin of Adam and Eve was sex, which meant that a Shaker was by definition a celibate). Their all-important millenarian outlook (the vision on Christ's 'thousand year reign' in the future) overshadowed all other considerations and fuelled a singular focus on the Rapture.

Jesus had said, "About the day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Matt 24:36), but like many over the centuries, the social upheavals of their time had made the Shakers vulnerable to apocalyptic imagination and to authority figures who seemed to speak directly from God. And so they lived out their existence 'protecting' themselves from society, and speculating about the future.

In a little over a hundred years the Shakers became unsustainable, their communities imploded, and their villages became desolate. Ironically, although they had defined themselves by convictions about "...we must never forget that no misinterpretation of Scripture is innocuous, it can have massive consequences."

the future, the future was the very thing that eluded the Shakers.

Our world is going through unprecedented turmoil and social upheaval. With the devastating effects of the third wave of COVID-19 infections and the onset of the greatest meltdown of the Sri Lankan economy, I daresay that the engines of apocalyptic imagination are already on overdrive. This will undoubtedly give rise to bizarre theologies, and new prophets and seers will appear on social media, espousing wild speculations and timetables about the future.

All such tendencies usually begin though with seemingly а innocuous misuse of Scripture; a fanciful, interesting, populist interpretation that would fly under the radar. Yet, we must forget never that no misinterpretation of Scripture is innocuous, it can have massive consequences.






