Those who hold an accredited theology degree are required to complete:

## **COUNSELLING**

#### THOSE WITH A THEOLOGY DEGREE

Those who hold an accredited theology degree are required to complete:

- 30 MA credits (= 10 MA courses of 3 credits each)
- 2 Internships (3 credits each)
- 1 Project (6 credits)

#### THOSE WITHOUT A THEOLOGY DEGREE

Those who do not hold a theology degree are required to complete:

- 30 MA credits (= 10 MA courses of 3 credits each)
- 30 theological credits\*
- 2 Internships (3 credits each)
- 1 Project (6 credits)

#### \* Holders of the CTS Advanced Certificate in Counsellina

Those who hold the CTS ACC are given advanced standing, and are required to complete a quantum of courses in consultation with the MA Programme Coordinator in lieu of the 30 theological credits as mentioned above.



## THE MA/PGDip PROGRAMME

Designed to equip teachers, writers, counsellors, and researchers for the Church

The CTS MA programme is designed to provide local students the opportunity to benefit from international standards of scholarship without having to leave the country or give up work and/or ministry to pursue education at master's level. While the courses do require a high level of commitment and periods of intense work, they have been designed with today's active Christian in mind. Classes are held on weekday evenings and Saturdays, and students can enroll at any time during the year.

### **SPECIALISED TRACKS**

#### **BIBLICAL STUDIES**

This track provides the student the opportunity to develop a clear grasp of the various methodological approaches to the interpretation of biblical and related texts, to clearly evaluate the appropriateness of the application of particular hermeneutical methods to specific texts, and to become proficient in the use of the various tools available for biblical studies.

#### **INTERCULTURAL STUDIES**

This track provides the student the opportunity to develop a biblical and theological foundation for missiological theory and reflection, to understand and learn to exegete culture, to become familiar with anthropological theories and issues relating to intercultural communication with special reflection on one's own ministry context.

#### COUNSELLING

Designed to train Christians to be competent counsellors, who will be able to:

**Counsel:** By integrating the Christian faith and up-to-date counselling theories to provide effective counselling in diverse, clinical, educational, and ministry settings.

**Educate:** By training others - especially Sinhala - and Tamillanguage Christian counsellors.

**Write:** By producing Bible-based, contextually-relevant resource material in English, Sinhala, and Tamil that will help in promoting relational and emotional healing and wellbeing

## **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

- Active involvement in a local church
- A minimum of a bachelors-level qualification
- Fluency in English (spoken and written)

## MA/PGDip COURSES 2022

#### The Letter to the Hebrews (10<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> January)

Hebrews stands as a monument to early Christian reflection on the significance of the work of Jesus, his benefits, and the response to faith. This course will allow students to explore the author's interpretation of Old Testament Scriptures and deployment of a variety of rhetorical strategies in the service of motivating his addressees' perseverance in their allegiance to Jesus in the midst of an unsupportive society.

## **People on the Move:**

#### When Mission and Migration Meet (7th – 26th March)

The course would look at the experience of migration and diaspora formation among the people of God in the biblical narrative, and examine the implications this has for missional engagement with multiplying migrant and diaspora communities around the globe today. A major part of the content would be dealing with a 'theology' of migration in Genesis 1-11 and then analysing Israel's experience in the Old Testament as a diaspora community and using that as a model to understand and minister to diaspora communities today.

## Hermeneutics of Scripture (9th – 23rd May)

Hermeneutics of Scripture aims to enable students to reflect on the authority of Scripture and gain expertise in the principles and tasks of interpreting Scripture. It includes an overview of different paradigms of interpreting Scripture in the history of the Church and introduces significant current trends.

synthesises its message, and contextualises this for a contemporary audience. It attempts to grapple with the problem of theodicy and responds to the following questions: Why does God allow pain and suffering? Why do godly people suffer? In the darkest time, what will sustain a person who is in pain? When God does not answer prayers, how are believers to deal with the perceived silence on His part?

This course will examine the concept of culture and how the hermeneutics of culture shape the way we interpret our perceptions and experiences of the world around us. The course seeks to equip students to interpret their own culture and to examine the ways in which culture and theology impact each other, so that you will be more effectively prepared to minister in cross-cultural contexts.
