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GENERAL INFORMATION

CTS Courses:

- A typical CTS course is 13 weeks in duration, at a frequency of one class a week.
- Modular courses are intensive courses conducted over 4 full days.
- While most courses have a total of 24 classroom hours, some have a total of 36 classroom hours, or 24 classroom hours + practical work amounting to 12 hours.

Course Delivery

- **Onsite:** The course is taught at the CTS campus in Kohuwela.
- Online: The course is taught via Zoom and course material is made available on Moodle. You will require a strong internet connection and a digital device.
- Hybrid: The course is taught as a combination of onsite and online. Some weeks your class
 will be held at the CTS campus in Kohuwela, while on other weeks it will be taught online.
 Your lecturer will inform you of the schedule at the commencement of the course.

The Second Letter to the Corinthians

2 Corinthians is a very personal and apologetic letter where Paul defends his apostolic claim and ministry but is pastoral about it in a situation that seems to have advanced beyond that of 1 Corinthians. This course seeks to explore 2 Corinthians in its historical, literary and theological context and hear how it might speak to churches facing similar issues. The Pentateuch

The course will look at specific texts within each of the Pentateuch texts, covering some core topics, such as the Shema, justice, and righteousness. It will also cover an introduction to tenets of the Israelite faith: election; covenant; land; Passover; Torah; temple/ tabernacle; the sacrificial system; and kingship. By the end of the course, you should be more familiar with the Pentateuch in terms of narratives, genres, key themes, literary styles and theological trends, past and present. You will also be introduced to key biblical scholars both Christian and Jewish. All these skills should enable to better interpret Scripture, as well as grow in love for the Pentateuch and Old Testament. And, above all that you would internalise the Shema (Deut 6:4) in loving the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and strength.


