CTS COURSES

A typical CTS course is taught over I3 weeks at a frequency of one class a week OR

over 4 full days ('modular' course)

*A 'credit' is equivalent to a total of I2 classroom hours

COURSE DELIVERY

Onsite: The course is taught at the CTS campus in Kohuwela.

Online: The course is taught via Zoom, and course material is made available on Moodle. You will require a strong internet connection and a digital device.

Hybrid: The course is taught as a combination of onsite and online. Some weeks your class will be held at the CTS campus in Kohuwela, while on other weeks it will be taught online. Your lecturer will inform you of the schedule at the commencement of the course.

INTERNSHIP

This component includes, in the early stages, practice of face-to-face counselling in class and other counselling-related skills; and at the final stage, a minimum number of face-to-face counselling hours, and regular supervision.

STEP 3: Attend interview.

STEP 4: You will be informed in writing of acceptance on to the programme.
